### **“Why should I be a member of the Enterprise Chamber of Commerce, Inc.?”**

The chamber sees on an average of 4 to 5 potential business owners per week and 5 to 6 business representatives per day. Newcomers, visitors, and information seekers use the chamber on a daily basis. The chamber mails more than 3000 information pieces and membership letters per month. The chamber has been a part of the Enterprise business community for 67 years.
2. The chamber has active programs that look at issues and concerns of the business community as well as the community in general. The chamber has 19 working committees consisting of people and partnerships to make Enterprise a better place to live and work. Let me share the Program of Work with you: (see Program of Work).
3. The chamber is the information center for the city. The chamber receives, on an average, 30~40 phone calls per day and 25 ~ 30 email informational requests. Requests include service and business referrals, relocation, directions, materials, job opportunities, concerns, and telephone numbers.
4. The chamber is the voice of business and the community. The chamber provides marketing materials such as maps, brochures, magazines, demographics, information and special acknowledgements for conferences, guests, dignitaries, businesses, and for other special occasions. The chamber also funds promotional advertisements to market Enterprise. (Such as magazine ads and InfoCenter Kiosks.)
5. The chamber recognizes excellence in the community with awards such as Business of the Month, Hospitality Award, Ray of Hope, Beautification Awards, and Business and Industry of the Year to encourage and promote good business quality living. The chamber recognizes new businesses with ground breakings and ribbon cuttings.
6. The chamber collaborates with business, government, public and private agencies and other entities to define and work on current and future needs of Enterprise. The chamber hosts meetings and breakfasts with local, state and federal leaders and legislators throughout the year.

7. What does the chamber do for your business? Having an active chamber helps Enterprise keeps a vibrant growth. A healthy business environment and a healthy community helps creates opportunities for success. Better opportunities for success equates to a higher rate of accomplishments and a better profit line for business.  
The chamber has various opportunities for networking, training and growing your business. To name a few, there are monthly Business After Hours, Legislative and Military Affairs Committee breakfasts, business seminars, promotional opportunities and free counseling through the chamber's partnership with the Small Business Administration, Sorrell College of Business, and Troy University. The chamber is a referral for your business when people inquire about services through the chamber. The chamber is a place for you to find information and to receive referrals of potential employees moving to the area. As a chamber member, you may leave information/ business cards at the chamber for newcomer's packets and packets for the monthly Welcome Briefing at Fort Rucker.
8. The chamber works to keep all aspects of our economic base strong. The chamber works directly with retail, service and tourism industries, retiree relocation, and existing businesses. The chamber works in partnership with ECGEDC on existing manufacturing. The chamber has a Workforce Council that addresses work issues and concerns. (Example: Shadow Day, workforce surveys.) (This council and the Business Committee will be joining forces in 2008 to become one, cohesive council to address business needs in Enterprise.) The chamber hosts such activities as Tourism Week, Retiree Week, Education Week, Small Business Development Week and other activities to encourage and support business and industry.
9. The chamber works in the community to develop a strong and a healthier community lifestyle through various partnership activities and events. (Example: Health Fair, Christmas Parade, Downtown Boll Weevil Festival.)
10. The primary funding of the chamber is through membership investment of the business and community sectors.
